New Testament

2 Timothy 2.8-15

A reading from the second letter to Timothy, chapter 2, beginning at verse 8.

Let us listen for the word of the Lord.

8 Remember Jesus Christ, raised from the dead, a descendant of David—that is my gospel, 9for which I suffer hardship, even to the point of being chained like a criminal. But the word of God is not chained. IOTherefore I endure everything for the sake of the elect, so that they may also obtain the salvation that is in Christ Jesus, with eternal glory. I I The saying is sure:

If we have died with him, we will also live with him; 12 if we endure, we will also reign with him;

if we deny him, he will also deny us;

13 if we are faithless, he remains faithful— for he cannot deny himself.

14 Remind them of this, and warn them before God that they are to avoid wrangling over words, which does no good but only ruins those who are listening. I5 Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved by him, a worker who has no need to be ashamed, rightly explaining the word of truth.

Gospel Reading

Luke 17.11-19

II On the way to Jerusalem Jesus was going through the region between Samaria and Galilee. I2As he entered a village; ten lepers approached him. Keeping their distance, I3they called out, saying, 'Jesus, Master, have mercy on us!' I4When he saw them, he said to them, 'Go and show yourselves to the priests.' And as they went, they were made clean. I5Then one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, praising God with a loud voice. I6He prostrated himself at Jesus' feet and thanked him. And he was a Samaritan. I7Then Jesus asked, 'Were not ten made clean? But the other nine, where are they? I8Was none of them found to return and give praise to God except this foreigner?' I9Then he said to him, 'Get up and go on your way; your faith has made you well.'
